Crime prevention policies that are founded on science and compassion, not rhetoric

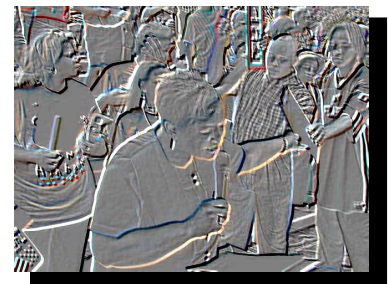
Amnesty for tens of thousands of eligible, nonviolent drug war prisoners
